Gail Borden Public Library Life Enrichment Team

Glenna Godinsky, Manager of Life Enrichment Services

Mission: The library where imagination and transformation flourish, fueled by the power of community.

The Gail Borden Library's Life Enrichment Team connects with over 25 senior and developmental care communities monthly, bringing engaging presentations, stories, crafts and music directly to residents. Driven by passion and selflessness, this dedicated team — under the leadership of Life Enrichment

Manager, Glenna Godinsky — thoughtfully plans and executes programs that ensure these oftenoverlooked community members feel seen and valued. By "meeting people where they're at," this team serves as a powerful model of community care, inspiring others to embrace the spirit of service.

Open Door Health Center

Open Door Health Center of IL (ODHCIL)

Mission: To provide comprehensive, patient-centered healthcare to the community, with a focus on sexual health and wellness for those at risk for or living with STIs and HIV/AIDS, while also serving the greater LGBTQ+ community.

Open Door is a regional, patient-centered healthcare organization dedicated to improving community health by offering a comprehensive "medical home" approach

to primary care. Specializing in sexual health and wellness, they provide free, confidential testing, prevention, diagnosis, and treatment for STIs, including HIV/AIDS, with a focus on serving marginalized and disproportionately affected communities. By removing barriers like ID requirements and actively engaging communities through trained Community Health Navigators, Open Door is building a powerful legacy defined by client-focused empowerment and the unwavering commitment to a world without HIV and sexual health stigma.



Elgin Symphony Orchestra

Marc Thayer and the Elgin Symphony Orchestra (ESO)

Mission: To build community through music via performance and education.

Executive Director Marc Thayer is recognized for his extraordinary leadership in revitalizing the ESO and transforming it into a beacon for Excellence in DEI and Building

Equity. Taking the helm in 2021 amid pandemic shutdowns, financial trouble, and a lack of a music director, Thayer not only steered the organization back from the brink of disaster—eliminating the deficit and increasing attendance by 80%—but also broadened its community relevance. A fluent Spanish speaker, his efforts have prioritized deep engagement with previously underserved populations, particularly the Hispanic community, through targeted outreach, a diverse board, and a dedicated Community Engagement Committee. Under his tenure, the ESO has reaffirmed its status as a world-class regional orchestra, collaborating with non-profits, performing at civic observances, and ensuring the power of music is accessible to all in Elgin.

GAMECHANGER PROJECTS

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Honor Society at Elgin Community College

Mission: To recognize and encourage academic achievement and provide opportunities for students to grow as scholars and leaders.

Recognizing that many students struggle with housing and basic needs, the PTK officer team partnered with KCT Credit Union to establish a sustainable, campus-wide financial

literacy program. This student-led effort included organizing workshops, co-hosting the impactful "Game of Life" event, and designing an innovative keychain resource hub, earning the chapter a prestigious College Project Award. Their legacy is the creation of the ECC/KCT Credit Union Student Advisory Board, which provides scholarships and empowers new students to continue this vital service, fostering financial confidence and strengthening the entire Elgin community.



Art Sculpture Trail

Art Sculpture Trail Habitat for Humanity of Northern Fox Valley (NFV)

Mission: To put God's love into action by building homes, communities, and hope. Its local vision is for a world where everyone has a decent place to live, which it works to achieve by building and improving homes in partnership with individuals and families in need of affordable housing.

The Art Sculpture Trail, which was displayed across several communities throughout the summer of 2025, innovatively blended public art, environmental stewardship and community

fundraising. This massive initiative launched 33 unique, environmentally-themed sculptures placed throughout the Elgin area, each painted by a local artist and sponsored by area businesses. The trail captivated the community, drove traffic to local businesses, and successfully highlighted Habitat NFV's groundbreaking net-zero housing developments. Culminating in a public auction, the project raised significant funds for Habitat's mission, proving that creative partnerships can build not just homes and hope, but also momentum for sustainable change and civic pride throughout the city.

Suzanne is a proud Elgin High School graduate, second-generation and 25-year U-46 educator.

Dr. Johnson's impact on the Elgin community is both deeply personal and systemic. Her legacy is being cemented by the Unite U-46 initiative, which secured an \$180 million bond and is now transforming learning environments for future

generations. This monumental plan includes building Elgin's first new

middle school since 1959, expanding preschool options, and ensuring all students have equitable access to academic and extracurricular programs.

Beyond capital improvements, her leadership is defined by radical inclusivity, setting the district's guiding principle: "All means all." She actively fosters community trust through transparency and genuine connection, highlighted by her "Johnson on the Job" video series where she publicly celebrates the vital work of nearly 7,000 employees in various roles. By consistently modeling empathy and a hands-on work ethic, she ensures that U-46 is not only a great place to learn but a welcoming, supportive environment that empowers students for successful futures.



Bill Angelo

In his nearly three-decade career, Coach Angelo — also an ECC alumnus has amassed over 850 career wins

Coach Angelo has transformed the Spartans' baseball program into a program of national distinction while serving as a profound mentorship pipeline for young men. Throughout his career, he has helped produce 20 NJCAA All-Americans, and led the team to five World Series appearances, making ECC baseball a source of immense community pride.

His true legacy is built on his philosophy of developing "quality

humans" through a strong work ethic and unwavering accountability. He instills values that transcend the field, providing every player with the resources to succeed academically and personally. This commitment has led to over 170 players transferring to four-year colleges and has fostered a deep, lifelong loyalty, with several alumni returning to serve as his assistant coaches. His mentorship ensures that players graduate as responsible, community-minded leaders who carry his positive influence into their families and neighborhoods throughout Elgin.
